

Sermon at the Synagogue

We know that Jesus was sent by God to save His people. But sometimes we refuse to listen to Him and like people of His time, we end rejecting the Kingdom of God!



Jesus started God's work at Nazareth, His hometown. It was Sabbath Day, the holy day of the week, and Jesus went to the Synagogue where He had been to school and worshipped God. Jesus was invited to read the Holy Scroll and chose a reading from the prophet Isaiah.

"The Spirit of the Lord is upon me because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom to the prisoners, to give the blind their sight, and to free the oppressed and announce that the time has come when the Lord will save his people."

Soon an angry mob shouted and shook their fists at Jesus. They dragged Him out and wanted to hurt Him, but Jesus walked through the crowd and went away.

It is sad that sometimes we too behave like the mob, and reject God's Son.

Jesus rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. All the people in the synagogue had their eyes fixed on him, as he said to them, "This passage of scripture has come true today, as you heard it being read." They were all well impressed with him and marveled at the eloquent words that he spoke. They said, "Isn't he the son of Joseph?"
