
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Book: A History of the Jewish People during the Babylonian, Persian and Greek Periods by Charles Foster Kent gives a scientific history of the Jewish people and the importance of the Temple of Jerusalem in 408 pages.

Book: *Return to Me* by Lynn Austin is a fictional narrative of the return of the Jewish people from Babylon to Jerusalem and in 459 pages it tells how King Cyrus joyfully prepares for their departure, only to learn that his family, grown comfortable in the pagan culture of Babylon, wants to remain back.

There were many difficulties along the way but the builders did not stop until the temple was completed.

After the temple, the builders set out to build a thick wall around Jerusalem so that it was well protected. The people celebrated its completion and thanked God for saving them from many misfortunes.
