All the apparitions after the Resurrection give us the same message. The first apparition of the Risen Jesus was to Mary Magdalene and other women who were going to embalm the body of Jesus only to find an empty tomb with the joyous angelic message that Jesus Who was crucified had risen indeed.

On their way back Jesus met them and greeted them with peace and told them, "Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me." It is this that prompted Pope John Paul II to call Mary Magdalene as 'the Apostle to the Apostles'.

Then came the much famous Emmaus encounter where Jesus walked like a stranger with the two disciples explaining everything from Moses and the prophets to the scriptural context of His suffering, death and resurrection and revealing Himself to them in the breaking of the bread.

What was the impact of this encounter? The disciples got courage and enthusiasm to proclaim that the Lord is risen, indeed. They got up at once and went to Jerusalem to tell the eleven disciples this most astounding and incredible message and while they were recounting their experience, Jesus stood among them and said, "Peace be with you."

The disciples thought they were seeing a ghost and were terrified. Jesus, to remove their doubts, showed them His hands and feet with nail marks, and even asked for and ate some food, so they may trust Him and gather courage.

After this, Jesus took them as far as Bethany where He blessed them and ascended into heaven in front of them giving them the great message for carrying His missionary work to the entire world: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you."
