P.A. Sangma, Speaker, Lok Sabha

Purno Agitok Sangma (1947–2016) was the Lok Sabha Speaker from 1996 to 1998, and Chief Minister of Meghalaya from 1988 to 1990. In 1977, he was elected to the Lok Sabha from Meghalaya and was re-elected multiple times. He is the first Christian to have served at one of the highest Constitutional posts in India. He was awarded the Padma Vibhushan posthumously.
