King David subdued the Philistines and other arch enemies of Israel and extended the borders of his kingdom from the Egyptian border to the Euphrates. His efficiency ushered in an era of peace and prosperity for his people. Jerusalem became centre of the Jewish government and worship under his rule. David's prime concern remained the Ark of Covenant installed at Kiriath-Jearim. He wanted to transfer this symbol of God's presence among His people to the new capital. The King himself led the joyous procession to bring the Ark to Jerusalem, where it was installed in a tent.

The king strongly desired to build a worthy dwelling for the Ark and sought the advice of Nathan, his trusted prophet and advisor. But the Lord told him through Nathan that he must first establish a dynasty of kings and his son, Solomon, would build the temple in Jerusalem.

David accepted the will of God and reigned in peace and joy. As God's true representative, he was responsible not only for the political unity but also the religious unity of the people of Israel.

When David installed the Ark of the Covenant in Jerusalem, his new capital, he sent an important message to his people by linking the presence of God to that of his monarchy. He made it known that the kings of Israel enjoyed a special relationship with God for the purpose of bringing peace, unity and prosperity to His chosen people.
