- 1. Barnabus went to Tarsus to look for Saul. When he found him, he took him to <u>Antioch</u>, and for a whole year the two met with the people of the church and taught a large group. It was at Antioch that the believers were first called Christians.
- 2. While they were serving the Lord and fasting in Antioch, the Holy Spirit said to them, "Set apart for me Barnabus and Saul to do the work to which I have called them.' Barnabus and Saul went to Seleucia and sailed from there to the island of Cyprus. When they arrived at Salamis, they preached the word in the synagogues. They went all the way across the island to Paphos.
 - 3. Paul and his companions sailed from Paphos and came to Perga, a city in Pamphylia. They went on and arrived in Antioch in Psidia, and on the Sabbath they went into the synagogue and Paul stood up and began to speak. The next Sabbath nearly everyone in the town came to hear the word of the Lord.
